- Pass a BSA physical for participation in backcountry activities
- Fully trained as a Venturing Leader or Scoutmaster

Course Size:

The course is limited to 32 participants; once that number is reached, the applicants have the option of being on a waiting list.

Course Framework

The Powder Horn course uses the requirements of the Ranger Award as the basis for the program.

Ranger Core Requirements: First Aid, Cooking, Communications, Emergency Preparedness, Land Navigation, Leave No Trace, Wilderness Survival, and Conservation

Planned Ranger Elective Requirements:

Backpacking, Cave Exploring, Cycling/Mt Biking, Ecology, Equestrian, First Aid, Fishing, Hunting, Lifesaver, Mountaineering, Outdoor Living History, Physical Fitness, Plants and Wildlife, Project COPE, SCUBA, Shooting Sports, Watercraft, Winter Sports

Other topics: Working with Teenagers, Goal Setting, Expedition Planning, Venture Program and Awards

Experts will present topics from both within and outside the BSA community. Each will have a thorough practical knowledge of the activity and the resources available to assist you.



Learning Objectives

- Detailed knowledge of the Ranger Award
- Knowledge of the BSA rules and regulations governing health and safety of outdoor programs
- Introduction to the skills and certifications necessary to operate an outdoor program
- How to obtain local resources and consultants for Ranger award activities

Note: This is program is *not* designed to make leaders experts or self-sufficient in any skill. The leader will still need to rely on knowledgeable, trained and certified individuals.

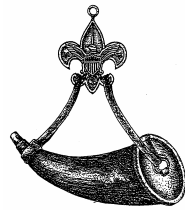
