- The Lannon was launched a few minutes before midnight on June 21, 1997.
- The Thomas E. Lannon's lines are based on those of the Gloucester fishing schooner Nokomis, designed by Capt. George Melville McClain in 1903.
- She is framed with white oak and black locust, from trees grown locally and donated by the Essex County Greenbelt and private landowners.
